#### Hello!

Welcome to our monthly newsletter, which will keep you up to date on what we're doing to keep communities safe in Colchester. It will focus on:

- The work of the Community Policing Team and Local Policing Team

The Community Policing Team includes the Town Centre Proactive Team. Their work includes responding to issues and carrying out proactive work, including public engagement, crime prevention, crime disruption, and safeguarding vulnerable people. The teams include specialist Missing Persons and Children'and Young Person officers, who work with partners in education and social care to protect vulnerable people from harm.

The Local Policing Team's main role is to respond to calls for assistance from members of the public, but they also carry out proactive patrols.

Our Colchester community and local policing officers are supported by detectives working in the Criminal Investigation Department, Domestic Abuse Investigation Team, and Crime and Public Protection Command. They investigate the more serious crimes that occur in north Essex, safeguard victims and bring offenders to justice.

Our priorities —in partnership with the Community Safety Partnership—mirror the Essex Police Force Plan for 2020/21

**Vulnerability** – we will ensure we engage with our communities to understand their needs and deliver policing to safeguard those who are vulnerable in our community.

Victims – we will provide victims with a first-class service.

**Visibility** – we will be visible in our communities to provide reassurance and reduce the fear of crime.




#### **Burglar taken off the streets!**

Over the last month Essex Police have been running a Darker Nights project which is aimed at reducing and detecting dwelling (house) burglaries.

On 18th December officers from our local policing team were called to reports of a burglary. Knowing the burglar had not long left the scene, officers attended quickly and found a suspect running away nearby. They took him to our custody suite whereby our team in CID took over.

Following some good investigation a 37 year old male, of no fixed abode was charged with three counts of burglary which had occurred in the Colchester area between November 2020 and December 2020. He has been remanded in custody to ensure he does not cause more harm to our community.



December saw Essex Police launch a "Christmas Giving Tree" which each district took part in. We were truly amazed by the generosity shown across Colchester. From our large businesses, to the smaller businesses to sole members of our community, the amount of donations we received exceeded our expectations so THANK YOU!

The donations received were wrapped by our officers and handed out to over 1100 children across Colchester who were unlikely to get much, or anything at all for Christmas. These children were identified by social care, schools and other partner agencies that deal with vulnerable families.

We even managed to find a good use for the left over boxes donating them to Colchester Zoo to help keep the animals entertained!





#### **Dealing with Anti Social Behaviour**

Throughout the early weeks of December we received a number of complaints regarding motorcycles using the underpass in Lucy Lane South, Colchester. This is a pedestrian only walk through and the loud noises echo from the underpass to nearby properties.

Following regular patrols of the area in a co-ordinated approach our officers, with the help of PD Astra, entered the underpass from either end to find a group of motorcycles under the underpass.

All five riders were issued with Section 59 warnings for antisocial use of vehicles. This means that if they ride in an antisocial manner again then their bikes will be seized by police.

We hope this will stop these motorcyclists causing a nuisance again.

#### Protect your new Christmas gifts

Over Christmas you may have been lucky enough to have received some rather nice gifts.

Have you got rid of the packaging yet? Left by the roadside for the recycling collection - what better advert to the thief of where to find some new things to steal. Where possible fold the boxes inside out, or tear the box up, or package it in something else, or take it to the recycling centre yourself.

How many of us have thought about **recording the serial numbers or property marking** it. Be it a cycle, electrical goods, garden equipment or mobile phone it may have a serial number. You can record your serial numbers free or charge at <u>www.immobilise.com</u> and others. There are also a number of property marking products available like indelible pens, UV marking pens, SelectaDNA, SmartWater, CRE mark by CRE products to name but a few (check suitability for the property item).



With **jewellery and antiques** don't forget to **take photographs** of it, include an "Object ID card" or ruler in a photograph to give it a scale. Some of these property marking products may also be suitable and you can now upload photographs of your property to Immobilise too.

Many TV's, personal music devices, computers and other electronics come **pre-loaded with security and/or tracking software**, make sure that it is activated. <u>If you are stor-</u> ing valuable college work or other on a laptop don't forget to back up your work elsewhere just in case you lose the laptop.

Smart phones: Don't forget to make a note of the IMEI number of a mobile phone, to find it key in \*#06#, with this if it's stolen you can block it. You can download an "App" on mobile phones to find your phone and more importantly wipe that data stored on it, check your "App store" or mobile phone provider. A little reminder -When texting or talking on phones, or listening to music remain "in touch" with your surroundings, a number of road accidents, thefts and assaults occur when we fail to note what's going on around us, don't forget to pass this advice on to children.
