Welcome to our monthly newsletter, which will keep you up to date on what we're doing to keep communities safe in Colchester. It will focus on:

The Community Policing Team includes the Town Centre Proactive Team. Their work includes responding to issues and carrying out proactive work, including public engagement, crime prevention, crime disruption, and safeguarding vulnerable people. The teams include specialist Missing Persons and Children' and Young Person officers, who work with partners in education and social care to protect vulnerable people from harm.

The Local Policing Team's main role is to respond to calls for assistance from members of the public, but they also carry out proactive patrols.

Our Colchester community and local policing officers are supported by detectives working in the Criminal Investigation Department, Domestic Abuse Investigation Team, and Crime and Public Protection Command. They investigate the more serious crimes that occur in north Essex, safeguard victims and bring offenders to justice.

Our priorities —in partnership with the Community Safety Partnership—mirror the Essex Police Force Plan for 2020/21

Dear All,

The team continue to strive to keep the public of Colchester safe throughout the pandemic. Officers are issued with appropriate Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) to keep themselves and the public we come into contact safe.

The Community Policing Team provide regular visible patrols across the district in conjunction with COVID 19 patrol plan and investigate reports of anti-social behaviour across the district.

Our Local Policing Teams respond to emergency incidents 24/7 and investigate the volume crime matters.



There are a number of ways to report incidents to Essex Police, dialling 999 for an emergency incident or 101 for an non emergency.

What classes as an emergency incident?

Does it feel like the situation could get heated or violent very soon? Is someone in immediate danger? Do you need support right away?

I would encourage non emergency incidents, concerns or reports of Anti-social behaviour to be reported online at www.essex.police.uk.

There is also a 'live Chat' facility available to speak to a member of our team.



Colchester District has seen a decrease in all recorded crime from December 2019 to 2020 by 7.3%.

Three Cannabis factories found in January


Colchester community policing team have taken over 2,000 cannabis plants off of the streets this month valued near to half a million pounds!

It started at a warrant being executed by the team at the old rectory, Spring lane, Colchester whereby in excess of 1,800 plants were recovered. Three males were arrested and have since been charged and remanded in custody.

We then received some intelligence to say there was a factory in a flat located on top of a care home in Highwoods. Over 40 plants were found to be growing in the property. A male has been arrested and remains under investigation in regards to this.

To end the month acting after community intelligence the team executed a warrant on The Willows, finding over 300 plants being grown. A man has been arrested, charged and remanded in custody in regards to this.

These factories are linked to organised crime groups who profit from these illegal activities.



Patrolling our beautiful villages

This month we have been enjoying patrolling our beautiful villages and rural towns. We have also emailed all of our parish councils and held online Q&A sessions for all of our rural villages and towns to give them the opportunity to explain and discuss any issues they have within the rural communities. We continue to patrol all areas of our district so if you see us out and about please say hello or give us a wave.



Dealing with Anti social behaviour

Following reports of anti social driving around Stanes park, Stanway we have put up signage that will warn drivers if their vehicles are driven in an anti social manner they could be seized under section 59 police reform act 2002.

Regular patrols take place to reduce this behaviour and we work closely with Colchester borough council, the safer Colchester partnership and the local neighbourhood watch schemes to tackle ASB in all areas of the town.

Weapon Surrender scheme

THE OFFENSIVE WEAPONS ACT WILL MAKE IT UNLAWFUL TO POSSESS

KEEPING DANGEROUS WEAPONS OFF THE STREETS

In a bid to make our streets safer the new offensive weapons act makes it illegal to possess a range of weapons in your home, which were previously legal to own.

If you own certain style knives, even for decoration they could now be illegal to have in your house. The government is offering compensation for the surrender of these weapons before 9th March 2021.

Staying safe online

There is a new website called **OMEGLE.COM** which allows users to log in to web cam chats and chat groups without having to register. An incident involving a young child being coerced into exposing themselves online and being exposed to males engaging in sexual activity has been reported to the police. The description given by the website is: **Omegle is a free online chat website that allows users to socialize with others without the need to register. The service randomly pairs users in one-on-one chat sessions where they chat anonymously using the names "You" and "Stranger" or "Stranger 1" and "Stranger 2" in the case of Spy mode.**

This means that this website could be accessed by anyone with any intention without personal information needing to be handed over. The website is not based in the UK meaning that any young persons who log on are likely to be talking to persons from all over the world.

This website can be easily accessed by anyone and maybe a trend amongst young persons. Please be vigilant and ensure that the correct safeguards and precautions are being taken. With the correct safety settings on WIFI and parental controls the website will likely be blocked. We are unsure on how young persons are aware of the website and how they are accessing it at this time but Investigations are ongoing into these incidents.
