MORE HARECOURSERS CAUGHT

RET continued tackling illegal hare coursing in January.

7 Community Protection Warnings were issued over the month to people suspected of engaging in this cruel sport. The team also



look to prosecute under the Hunting Act where possible.

Two males were also charged with trespassing on land with dogs to pursue rabbits and are awaiting court.



RET have successfully worked with 6 surrounding forces and the police helicopter under Operation Galileo to keep targeting hare coursers.

SAFER ROADS

RET have focused on rural road safety throughout January.

Speeding checks have been carried out country wide.

In Ongar two cars were seized for having no insurance and six tickets issued.



Meanwhile in Dunmow 35 tickets were issued in one day and another two vehicles seized for not having valid insurance.

DRIVER JAILED

A driver who had been disqualified from driving by the courts was caught driving in Witham by RET.

The vehicle raised officers suspicions and was stopped. The driver was found to be banned from driving, and had been banned several times in then past.

To protect the public RET applied to remand the driver in custody overnight. At court the following day he was sent to prison for 28 weeks.

STOLEN VEHICLES RECOVERED

The team have continued to target those who steal vehicles, recovering two in January.



A stolen van was located in Wickford, stripped for

parts. Meanwhile, the team located a stolen trailer in Basildon.
